Let's Build A Bridge: St. Michael to Twin With Two Parishes

As representatives of St. Michael Parish and the Community Outreach Commission, we went to Tennessee in April to meet with Fr. Dennis Holly to discuss the idea of twinning with the two missionary parishes he pastors. His parishes are Holy Family Church (60 families – 100 parishioners) in Lafayette, TN, and Christ the King Church (50 families – 100 parishioners) in Scottsville, KY. On Saturday, we met with Fr. Holly and leaders of parish council and ladies guild from Holy Family Church to brainstorm ideas for working together to build relationships and work toward the needs of the community. Their biggest desire is the need to build a bridge for two of their parishioners, Chuck and Beverly Glaser. Chuck suffered a massive stroke at the age of 38 and now also has Parkinson's disease, confining him to his wheelchair. They live in the "holler," and it requires a drive over an old wooden bridge. The county will not allow emergency vehicles to cross the bridge to get to them. (Note: Since our visit, the rain storms washed out the bridge.) After our meeting, they treated us to a pot luck supper.

The following morning we attended the 8:30 am Mass and met the parishioners of Holy Family. Mass is held in a rented basement space originally built for another church. We joined them for their weekly coffee and donut breakfast after Mass. At 10:15, Fr. Holly had us follow him to Christ the King Church for the 11 am Mass in their new building. When there are only 100 parishioners, they recognize newcomers, so we were warmly welcomed. Following Mass we enjoyed lunch which they have after Mass each week in their gathering room/kitchen, currently unfinished. We then met with Fr. Holly and members of their parish council and King's Angels (ladies guild). Some of their suggestions included working together with Barren River Safe Space, Inc.*, which provides services to the county and Camp Courageous*, an organization for children with serious/terminal illnesses in Scottsville, KY. One of their requests was help with their kitchen renovation – putting up drywall, etc. They're hoping to be able to put in a real kitchen.

Both parishes discussed how we could be of service by helping with Youth Ministry; Vacation Bible School; school supplies; and school clothes. Both parishes are surrounded by the very poor and while both parishes work hard at helping with those needs, their small numbers can only do so much. Members of both parishes would like to come to Cincinnati to share their stories and participate with us on a retreat to strengthen our relationship.

It's important to note that the Catholic Church makes up 1/10th of 1 percent! And a whopping 80% are unchurched in the Scottsville area and 75% in Macon County, TN.
